Fire Safety













he July 20, 2017 grass fire at the Byrne Preserve was a wake-up call for all residents to be aware of the importance of fire prevention. Many homes in the Town of Los Altos Hills are located in a Hazardous Fire Area and some of the homes in the mountainous Unincorporated Areas of the Fire District are within the State's High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. For these reasons it is important for residents to complete the following:

- Create at least 30 feet (100 feet if you live in the mountainous unincorporated High Fire Hazard Severity Zone) of defensible space around your home
- Clear ornamental shrubs and trees of dead leaves and branches
- Remove all pine needles and leaves from roofs, eaves and rain gutters
- Trim tree limbs 10 feet from chimneys or stove pipes, and remove dead limbs that hang over rooftops
- Cover chimney outlets or flues with a ½ inch mesh spark arrestor
- Post a clearly visible house address, using at least 4 inch high numbers, for easy identification

Personal Emergency Preparedness (PEP)

When disaster strikes... it may be several days before emergency services arrive in your neighborhood. This FREE 3-hour training class is designed for individuals and families to be able to survive the first 72 hours following a disaster. This class includes information on types of disasters, home and work place preparedness, fire safety, treating life-threatening conditions, and how to build a disaster supplies kit.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Training

In the event of an area wide disaster, critical infrastructure and emergency services will be impacted. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) academy trains residents to prepare for and respond to life-threatening events in their community. CERT members can mobilize neighborhood resources, deliver immediate assistance to victims, organize emergency communications and provide support to first responders.

CERT training academies are offered in the communities served by the Santa Clara County Fire Department Office of Emergency Services and locations rotate throughout the year. Some of the skills taught include organizing resources, medical operations, basic search and rescue, how to use a fire extinguisher and damage assessment. The course is over a period of 3 weeks, normally two classes a week.
