FRS Radio Proposal

Currently our CERT program is using FRS (Family Radio Service) radios for communications in and around the ARK. These radios are also sent out with CERT members who do not have radios or ones that cannot communicate the distances we need in sending messages back to the ARK.

Our Disaster Trailers also have FRS radios that have been in use for over 6 years, many of them have quit working, leaving us with about 4 FRS radios in each trailer. We currently have 14 good FRS radios in the ARK.

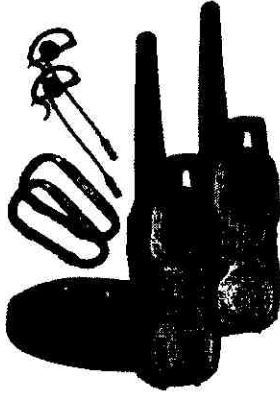
I am proposing that we move the current ARK radios in to the 2 trailers and replace the ones in the ARK with new radios. I have set up a committee to research and come up with a recommendation for new FRS radios for the ARK. This is what they recommended.

I am asking the LAHCFD Board to approve (24) 12 sets of Uniden GMR4040-2CKHS radios. Cost is \$ 61.16 for 2 radios. I have attached a spec sheet and cost breakdown for the proposal.

Communications in a disaster is paramount to a successful outcome of the event, with these FRS radios our CERT team members will be able to successfully carry out their duties in the event of a disaster.

Total cost for this proposal is: 12 sets of radios = \$ 733,92 = Tax, shipping.

Animal Micro Chip Proposal
3-28-13**

Currently we have 19 people involved in our LAHCFD Large Animal Evacuation program. The Santa Clara County Office of Emergency Services has designed and implemented a Large Animal Evacuation program for the entire county; we are part of Zone #1.

In the event of an emergency where Large Animals need to be evacuated on orders from the fire department, our group would be assisting homeowners in evacuating any large animals they may have. This may also include small animals such as dogs and cats, but Large Animals are our major concern in a disaster.

Upon removing the animals from danger, they will be transported to staging areas via horse trailers with volunteers throughout the county. Once at the staging area there is a need to be able to identify these large animals. Most of our large animals such as horses have microchips embedded in the neck area with owner identification. In order to read these microchips we need a micro chip scanner, currently we do not have one. The closest one available is from the Santa Clara County Animal Control officers, who in all high probability will not be in our area.

I am asking that the LAHCFD board approve a microchip scanner for our use in a disaster.

I have attached a copy of the microchip reader we wish to purchase. This will be kept in the Large Animal ARK at the Toyon Water District yard along with all of our other large and small animal supplies.

Cost for the microchip reader is \$329.95 = tax and shipping. Total should be around \$360.00
