Dear Property Owner:

Wildfire season has increasingly become longer, scarier, and more dangerous to fight, while burning more acreage, more houses, and costing more money to control. In 2015, while enduring an unprecedented drought, California endured an above-average year for wildfires. Although this El Nino season has brought us rain and we hope for more, we are cautioned that the benefits are temporary. With the rain comes the growth of vegetation that becomes fuel for wildfires. Fuel moisture levels in vegetation are still well below average and our County is still in a severe to extreme drought condition. On February 2, the State Water Resources Control Board extended the California Drought Emergency through October 2016.

As a property owner, you must take personal responsibility to prepare your home from wildfire by creating and maintaining a defensible space. Creating and maintaining a defensible space will give your home a fighting chance against an approaching wildfire. To accomplish this, you must remove flammable brush, vegetation, and dry grasses a distance of at least 30 feet from all structures. For sloped areas that exceed 20% on the downhill side of your home, up to 100 feet of defensible space should be provided.

For ornamental shrubs and bushes adjacent to your home, we recommend planting a fireretardant variety. If there is a possibility that erosion may occur, any native vegetation that is removed should be replaced with fire-retardant vegetation.

The Fire District works diligently to ensure the public's safety by requiring homeowners to remove potential hazards. Reminding property owners about wildfire safety is an important step towards achieving a fire safe community.

Following is a list of required and recommended measures that will not only bring your property into compliance, but also greatly reduce the risk of loss or damage to your home.

Required Safety Regulations (Items A-E)

- A. All flammable vegetation must be cleared a minimum of 30 feet around structures. Ornamental shrubbery and trees cleared of dead leaves and branches.
- B. Roofs, eaves and rain gutters must be cleared of pine needles, leaves, or other debris
- C. Trim tree limbs 10 feet from chimneys and/or stovepipes. Dead limbs hanging over the house or garage must be trimmed.
- D. Chimney outlets or flues shall be covered with a spark arresting ½" mesh screen.
- E. Address shall be clearly visible for easy identification in an emergency.

Note: Grading is prohibited within the Town of Los Altos Hills prior to April 1, 2016. Due to the increased erosion potential, discing is considered to be a form a grading and similarly prohibited.

Additional Safety Recommendations (Items F-I)

- F. Trees 18 feet or taller should be limbed up 6 feet from the ground. Provide additional vertical clearance when trees have vegetation beneath it. Removing low tree limbs can also help prevent fires on the ground from reaching the canopies of the trees around your home.
- G. Woodpiles should be stacked a minimum of 30 feet from buildings, fences, and other combustible materials.
- H. All vegetation and other flammable materials should be cleared from beneath decks. Elevated decks should be enclosed with fire resistive materials.
- I. If you have any trees near power lines please contact PG&E at 1-800-PGE-5000 for a free inspection. State Law requires vegetation clearance from electrical lines. For more information please visit www.PGE.com. In most cases PG& E will trim or remove the tree at no cost to you.

Your property, as referenced above, is located in the designated Wildland-Urban Interface Fire Area (WUI), which requires property owners to complete the Required Safety Regulations (Items A-E). Please complete and return the enclosed postcard on or before **April 1, 2016**. Beginning the first week of April, District staff will conduct inspections to advice property owners who have <u>not</u> implemented the fire hazard abatement measures what work is necessary in order to be in compliance with the applicable regulations. If you are unable to complete the required work prior to **April 1, 2016** due to late season rain or other hardships, please contact our office as soon as possible.

When determining how to best perform the brush abatement measures, consider the following:

- a) You may do the work yourself, or hire a contractor to do it. **NOTE**: The Los Altos Hills County Fire District operates a yard waste disposal event on the 3rd Saturday of each month at Foothill College, where residents can dispose of yard waste at no charge. For more information contact Green Waste Company at (408) 938-4916. Additionally, the Los Altos Hills County Fire District will be providing a brush chipping service for all properties within the Fire District this year (Note: brush must be cut and piled prior to chipping). Residents will be mailed more detailed information about the chipping program from the Fire District.
- b) You may request to schedule the District's authorized contractor to do the work on your behalf, and have the cost placed on your property tax bill. If you would like this service, please check the appropriate box on the postcard or call (408) 378-4010 prior to **April 1, 2016**.

Note: follow-up inspections will begin on or after **June 1, 2016** for properties that did not comply at the time of the first inspection. If you fail to take the necessary action as of this date, the District will have its contractor do the work, and the cost will be placed on your property tax bill.

If your property is found to be in compliance at the time of the re-inspection or upon the arrival of the abatement contractor, no work will be done and no charges will be imposed.

RECITALS

- A. District desires to retain the professional arborist services of Consultant as an independent contractor to provide Certified Arborist Services to the District.
- B. Consultant represents that it is fully qualified to perform such services by virtue of its experience and the training, education and expertise of its principals and employees.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of performance by the parties of the promises, covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>SCOPE AND LEVEL OF SERVICES</u>. Consultant will respond to residents who wish to have (1) eucalyptus trees on their property removed or pruned or (2) other trees on their property that are dead or dying removed. Consultant will also prepare a spreadsheet showing the name, address and phone numbers of each resident who qualifies for tree work to be done; relevant information about the tree(s) that require work, including location, tag number, species, diameter, height; and relevant information on work to be done, including designation of work (i.e. prune or remove), estimated hours for work, priority ranking based on risk of fire to nearby buildings, and any other recommendations.
- 2. <u>TIME OF PERFORMANCE</u>. The services shall be performed on a timely, regular basis and the services provided by Consultant to District shall be completed within three (3) months of execution of this Contract. The Parties may mutually agree to extend or shorten the time of performance based on the number of trees residents request Consultant to evaluate.
- 3. <u>STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE</u>. As a material inducement to the District to enter into this Contract, Consultant hereby represents and warrants that it has the qualifications and experience necessary to undertake the services to be provided pursuant to this Contract. Consultant agrees to use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by members of Consultant's profession and in a manner reasonably satisfactory to the District. Consultant hereby covenants that it shall follow professional standards in performing all services required hereunder and will perform the services to a standard of reasonable professional care.

- 4. <u>COMPLAINCE WITH LAW</u>. All services rendered hereunder by Consultant shall be provided in accordance with all ordinances, resolutions, statutes, rules and regulations of the District, and any federal, state or local governmental agency having jurisdiction in effect at the time the service is rendered.
- 5. <u>TERM</u>. This Contract is effective on the date set forth in the initial paragraph of this Contract and shall remain in effect until the services required hereunder have been satisfactorily completed by Consultant, unless earlier terminated pursuant to Section 16, below.
- 6. <u>COMPENSATION</u>. The District agrees to compensate Consultant for its services according to the fee schedule set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u>.
- 7. <u>METHOD OF PAYMENT</u>. Consultant shall invoice the District for work performed after each task is completed. Payments to Consultant by District shall be made within thirty (30) days after receipt by District of Consultant's itemized invoices.
- INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. Consultant is, and shall at all times remain as to the District, a wholly independent contractor and not an agent or employee of District. Consultant shall receive no premium or enhanced pay for work normally understood as overtime, nor shall Consultant receive holiday pay, sick leave, administrative leave, or pay for any other time not actually worked. The intention of the parties is that Consultant shall not be eligible for benefits and shall receive no compensation from the District except as expressly set forth in this Contract. Consultant shall have no power to incur any debt, obligation, or liability on behalf of the District or otherwise act on behalf of the District as an agent. Neither the District, nor any of its agents shall have control over the conduct of Consultant or any of Consultant's employees, except as set forth in this Contract. Consultant shall at no time, or in any manner, represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner employees of the District. Consultant agrees to pay all required taxes on amounts paid to Consultant under this Contract, and to indemnify and hold the District harmless from any and all taxes, assessments, penalties, and interest asserted against the District by reason of the independent contractor relationship created by this Contract. Consultant shall fully comply with the worker's compensation law regarding Consultant and Consultant's employees. Consultant further agrees to indemnify and hold the District harmless from any failure of Consultant to comply with applicable worker's compensation laws. The District shall not have the right to offset against the amount of any fees due to Consultant under this Contract any amount due to District from Consultant as a result of Consultant's failure to promptly pay the District any reimbursement or indemnification arising under this Section.
- 9. <u>CONFIDENTIALITY</u>. Consultant, in the course of its duties, may have access to financial, accounting, statistical and personal data of private individuals and employees of the District. Consultant covenants that all data, documents, discussion, or other information developed and received by Consultant or provided for performance of this Contract are deemed confidential and shall not be disclosed by Consultant without written authorization by the District. The District shall grant such authorization if

disclosure is required by law. Upon request, all District data shall be returned to the District upon the termination of this Contract. Consultant's covenant under this Section shall survive the termination of this Contract.

- 10. <u>OWNERSHIP OF MATERIAL</u>. All reports, documents, or other written materials developed or discovered by Consultant or any other person engaged directly or indirectly by Consultant in the performance of this Contract shall be and remain the property of the District without restriction or limitation upon its use or dissemination by the District.
- 11. <u>CONFLICT OF INTEREST.</u> Consultant covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which may be affected by the services to be performed by Consultant under this Contract, or which would conflict in any manner with the performance of its services hereunder. Consultant further covenants that, in performance of this Contract, no person having any such interest shall be employed by it. Furthermore, Consultant shall avoid the appearance of having any interest which would conflict in any manner with the performance of its services pursuant to this Contract. Consultant agrees not to accept any employment or representation during the term of this Contract which is or may make Consultant "financially interested" (as provided in California Government Code Sections 1090 and 87100) in any decision made by the District on any matter in connection with which Consultant has been retained pursuant to this Contract. Nothing in this section shall, however, preclude Consultant from accepting other engagements with the District.
- 12. <u>ASSIGNABILITY</u>; <u>SUBCONTRACTING</u>. The parties agree that the expertise and experience of Consultant are material considerations for this Contract. Consultant shall not assign, transfer, or subcontract any interest in this Contract, nor the performance of any of Consultant's obligations hereunder, without the prior written consent of the District Council, and any attempt by Consultant to do so shall be void and of no effect and a breach of this Contract.

13. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>.

- 13.1. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant shall indemnify, defend (with independent counsel approved by the District) and hold harmless the District, and its elective or appointive boards, officers, employees agents and volunteers against any claims, losses, or liability that may arise out of or result from damages to property or personal injury received by reason of, or in the course of work performed under this Contract due to the acts or omissions of Consultant or Consultant's officers, employees, agents or subcontractors. The provisions of this Section survive completion of the services or the termination of this Contract. The acceptance of such services shall not operate as a waiver of such right of indemnification.
- 13.2 With regard to Consultant's professional services, Consultant agrees to use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by members of Consultant's profession, including without limitation adherence to all applicable safety standards. To the fullest extent permitted by law,

Consultant shall indemnify, defend (with independent counsel approved by the District) and hold harmless the District, and its elective or appointive boards, officers, and employees from and against all liabilities, including without limitation all claims, losses, damages, penalties, fines, and judgments, associated investigation and administrative expenses, and defense costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees, court costs and costs of alternative dispute resolution regardless of nature or type that arise out of, pertain to, or relate to the negligence, reckless, or willful misconduct of Consultant or Consultant's officers, employees, agents or subcontractors. The provisions of this Section survive completion of the services or the termination of this Contract. The acceptance of said services and duties by District shall not operate as a waiver of such right of indemnification.

- 13.3 The District does not and shall not waive any rights that they may possess against Consultant because of the acceptance by the District or the deposit with the District of any insurance policy or certificate required pursuant to this Contract. This hold harmless and indemnification provision shall apply regardless of whether or not any insurance policies are determined to be applicable to the claim, demand, damage, liability, loss, cost or expense.
- 14. <u>INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS</u>. Consultant agrees to have and maintain the policies set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u> entitled "INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS," which is attached hereto and incorporated herein. All policies, endorsements, certificates, and/or binders shall be subject to approval by the District's Attorney as to form and content. These requirements are subject to amendment or waiver only if so approved in writing by the District's Attorney. Consultant agrees to provide District with a copy of said policies, certificates, and/or endorsements before work commences under this Contract. A lapse in any required amount or type of insurance coverage during this Contract shall be a breach of this Contract.
- 15. <u>SUSPENSION</u>. The District may, in writing, order Consultant to suspend all or any part of Consultant's services under this Contract for the convenience of the District, or for work stoppages beyond the control of the District or the Consultant. Subject to the provisions of this Contract relating to termination, a suspension of work does not void this Contract. In the event that work is suspended for a period exceeding 120 days, the schedule and cost for completion of the work will be adjusted by mutual consent of the parties.

16. <u>TERMINATION</u>.

16.1 This Contract may be terminated by either the District or Consultant following five (5) days written notice of intention to terminate. In the event the Contract is terminated, Consultant shall be paid for any services properly performed to the last working day the Contract is in effect. Consultant shall substantiate the final cost of services by an itemized, written statement submitted to the District. The District's right of termination shall be in addition to all other remedies available under law to the District.

- 16.2 In the event of termination, Consultant shall deliver to the District copies of all reports, documents, computer disks, and other work prepared by Consultant under this Contract, if any. If Consultant's written work is contained on a hard computer disk, Consultant shall, in addition to providing a written copy of the information on the hard disk, immediately transfer all written work from the hard computer disk to a soft computer disk and deliver said soft computer disk to District. District shall not pay Consultant for services performed by Consultant through the last working day the Contract is in effect unless and until Consultant has delivered the above described items to the District.
- 17. CONSULTANT'S BOOKS AND RECORDS. Consultant shall maintain any and all ledgers, books of account, invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other records or documents evidencing or relating to charges for services, supplies, materials, or equipment provided to District for a minimum period of three (3) years, or for any longer period required by law, from the date of final payment to Consultant pursuant to this Contract. Consultant understands that the Public Records Act may apply to documents created under this Contract and Consultant covenants and agrees to assist District in responding to Public Record Act Requests at no additional cost to District. Consultant agrees that the Consultant's covenants under this Section shall survive the termination of this Contract.
- 18. NON-WAIVER OF TERMS, RIGHTS AND REMEDIES. Waiver by either party of any breach or violation of any one or more terms or conditions of this Contract shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other term or condition contained herein or a waiver of any subsequent breach or violation of the same or any other term or condition. Acceptance by the District of the performance of any work or services by Consultant shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any term or condition of this Contract. In no event shall the District's making of any payment to Consultant constitute or be construed as a waiver by the District of any breach of this Contract, or any default which may then exist on the part of Consultant, and the making of any such payment by the District shall in no way impair or prejudice any right or remedy available to the District with regard to such breach or default.
- 19. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any notices, bills, invoices, reports or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Contract shall be given in writing by personal delivery, by facsimile transmission with verification of receipt or by U.S. mail, postage prepaid, and return receipt requested, addressed to the respective parties as follows:

- 20. <u>NON-DISCRIMINATION AND EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY</u>. In the performance of this Contract, Consultant shall not discriminate against any employee, subcontractor or applicant for employment because of race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, age, physical or mental handicap, or medical condition. Consultant will take affirmative action to ensure that employees are treated without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, age, physical or mental handicap, or medical condition.
- 21. <u>ATTORNEYS' FEES; VENUE</u>. In the event that any party to this Contract commences any legal action or proceeding to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Contract, the prevailing party in such action or proceeding shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and other costs incurred in that action or proceeding, in addition to any other relief to which the successful party may be entitled. The venue for any litigation shall be Santa Clara County.
- 22. <u>COOPERATION</u>. In the event any claim or action is brought against the District relating to Consultant's performance or services under this Contract, Consultant shall render any reasonable assistance and cooperation which District might require.
- 23. <u>EXHIBITS, PRECEDENCE</u>. All documents referenced as exhibits in this Contract are hereby incorporated into this Contract.

This Contract may only be modified by a written amendment duly executed by the parties to this Contract.

EXHIBIT B

(INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS)

Consultant shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to or interference with property which may arise from, or in connection with, the performance of the work hereunder and the results of that work by the Consultant, its agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

- 1. <u>MINIMUM SCOPE OF INSURANCE</u>. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:
- 1.1 Insurance Services Office (ISO) Form No. CG 0001 covering Commercial General Liability on an "occurrence" basis, including products-completed operations, personal injury and advertising injury.
- 1.2 Insurance Services Office Form (ISO) No. CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, Code 1 (any auto), or if Consultant has no owned autos Code 8 (hired autos) and Code 9 (non-owned autos). If Consultant does not have Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance, he must show proof of Automobile Liability Insurance in accordance with Paragraph 2.2.
- 1.3 Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the Labor Code of the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.
- 1.4 Errors and Omissions Liability Insurance appropriate to the Consultant's profession. Architects' and Consultants' coverage is to be endorsed to include contractual liability.
- 2. <u>MINIMUM LIMITS OF INSURANCE</u>. Consultant shall maintain limits no less than:
- 2.1 <u>Commercial General Liability</u>. (Including products-completed operations, personal & advertising injury) One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence. If Commercial General Liability insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
- 2.2 <u>Automobile Liability</u>. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- 2.3 <u>Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability</u>. Workers' compensation insurance with Statutory Limits as required by the Labor Code of the State of California, and Employer's Liability Insurance with One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident for bodily injury or disease.

- 2.4 <u>Errors and Omissions Liability</u>. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence or claim, Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate.
- 3. <u>DEDUCTIBLES AND SELF-INSURED RETENTIONS</u>. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to, and approved by, the District. At the option of the District, either: the Consultant shall purchase insurance to reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the District, its officials, employees, agents and contractors; or the Consultant shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration and defense expenses in an amount specified by the District. The District may require the Consultant to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.

4. OTHER INSURANCE PROVISIONS.

- 4.1 <u>General Liability and Automobile Liability Coverages</u>. The General Liability and Automobile Liability insurance policies required pursuant to Sections 1.1 and 1.2 shall contain the following provisions:
- 4.1.1 The District, its officials, employees, agents, contractors and volunteers are covered as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by, or on behalf of, the Consultant including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations, and products and completed operations of the Consultant on premises owned, leased or used by the Consultant. The coverage shall be at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or both CG 20 10 and CG 23 37 if later versions used.
- 4.1.2 The Consultant's insurance coverage is the primary insurance as respects the District, its officials, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District, its officials, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers shall be excess of the Consultant's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 4.1.3 The Insurance Company agrees to waive all rights of subrogation against the District, its elected or appointed officers, officials, agents, and employees for losses paid under the terms of any policy which arise from work performed by the District's insurer.
- 4.1.4 Coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days prior written notice (10 days for non-payment) by regular mail has been given to the District.
- 4.1.5 Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the District, its officials, employees, agents or contractors.

- 4.1.6 Consultant's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 4.2 <u>Worker's Compensation Insurance</u>. The Worker's Compensation Policy required pursuant to Section 1.3 shall contain or be endorsed to contain the provisions set forth in subsections 4.1.3 and 4.1.4 above.
- 4.3 <u>Acceptability of Insurers</u>. All required insurance shall be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.
- 4.3 <u>Claims Made Policies</u>. If any of the required policies provide claims-made coverage, the District requires that coverage with a Retroactive Date prior to the contract effective date, or extended reporting period, be maintained by Consultant for a period of 5 years after completion of the contract.
- 5. <u>VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE</u>. Consultant shall furnish the District with original certificates and amendatory endorsements affecting coverage required by this clause. The certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the District before work commences. However, failure to obtain the required documents prior to the work beginning shall not waive Consultant's obligation to provide them. The District reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements affecting the coverage required by these specifications, at any time.

The May 2016 fire reports for the Los Altos Hills County Fire District are enclosed:

1. Average Response Time Analysis: This report provides data for the last three fiscal years on the average time it took for each first-in unit to arrive on scene. The computation starts from the moment the dispatcher makes his/her first keystroke at the command panel (after the call has been handed-off by the Emergency 911 telephone handler). This information is also graphically represented in the accompanying bar charts.

The arrival times for first-due units on code three calls was 8 minutes or less for:

Freeway: 75%

Metro/Urban: 100% Suburban: 85.71% Rural: 84.62%

- 2. <u>Incident Types by Month</u>: This report summarizes on a monthly basis, the number of incidents by call type, for every emergency vehicle that was the first unit on-scene. This information is also graphically represented in a pie chart depicting the number of incidents by type.
- 3. <u>Monetary Fire Loss by Month and Incident Type</u>: This report presents the monthly dollar loss in each of the fire type categories for the last three calendar years.

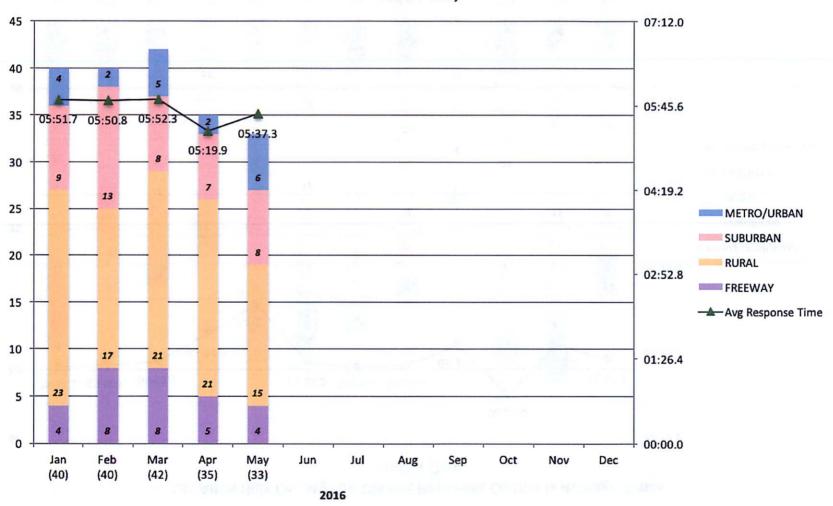

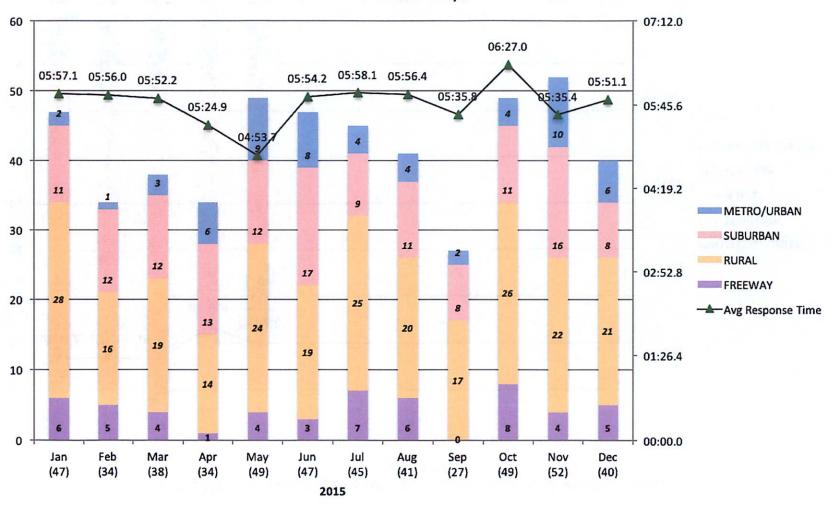

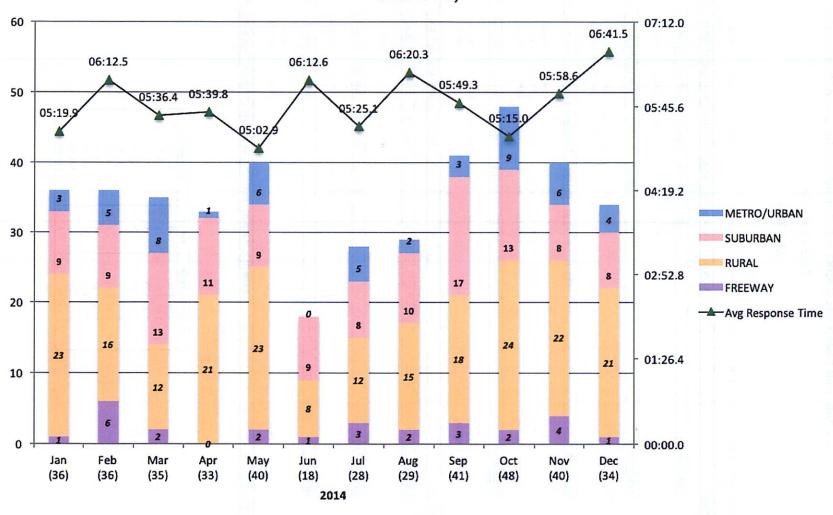
Los Altos Hills County Fire District Response Counts & Average Times Code 3 Only

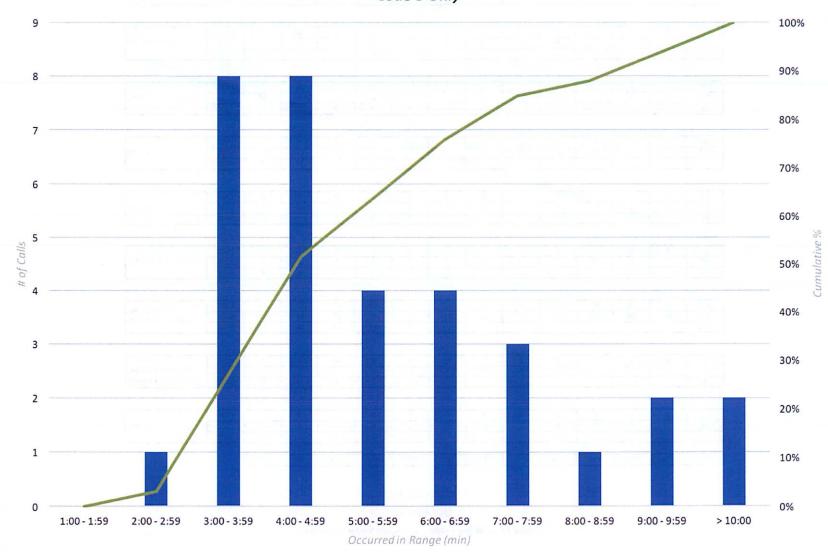

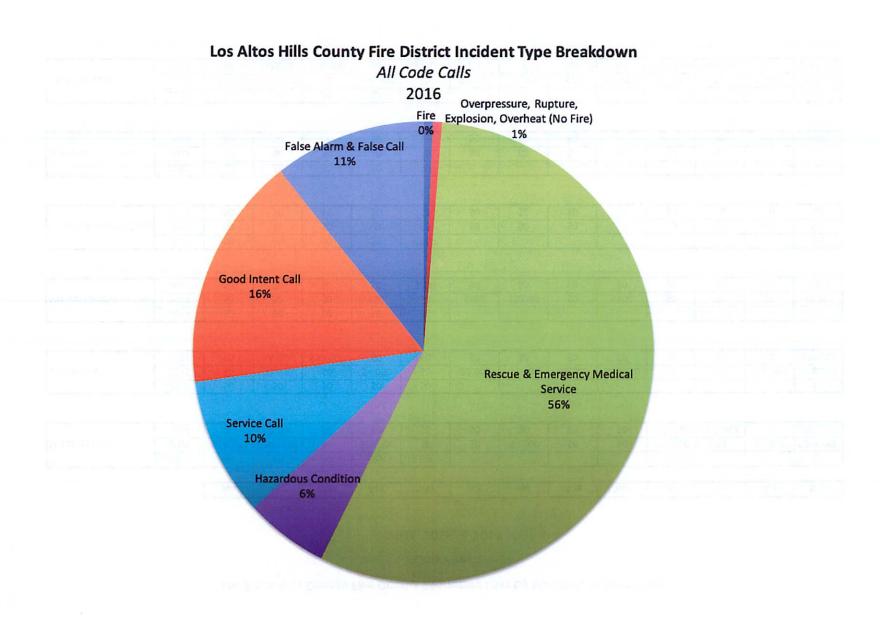


Los Altos Hills County Fire District Incidents by Month

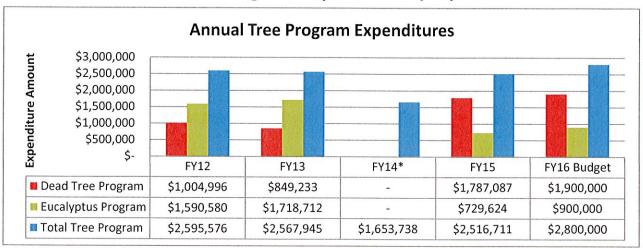

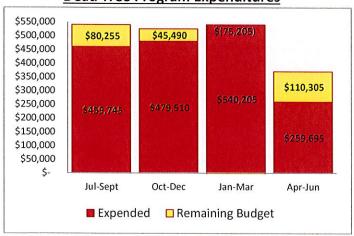

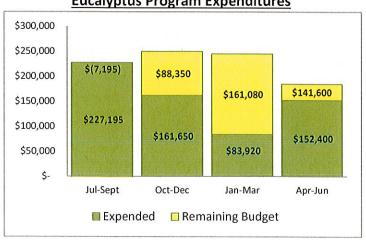
Dead Tree Program Expenditures



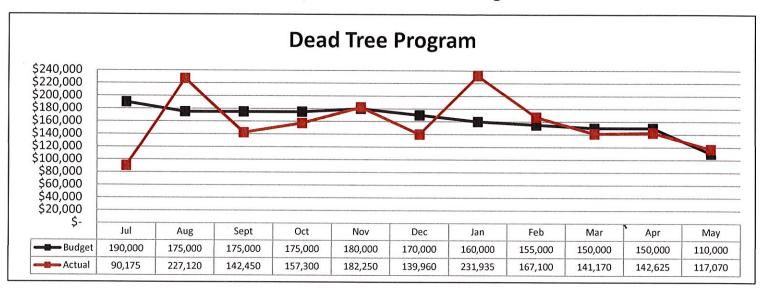

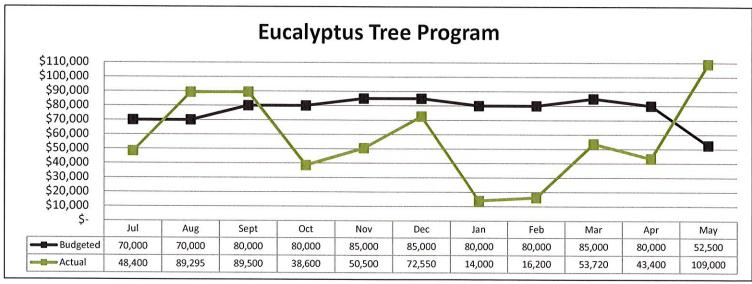

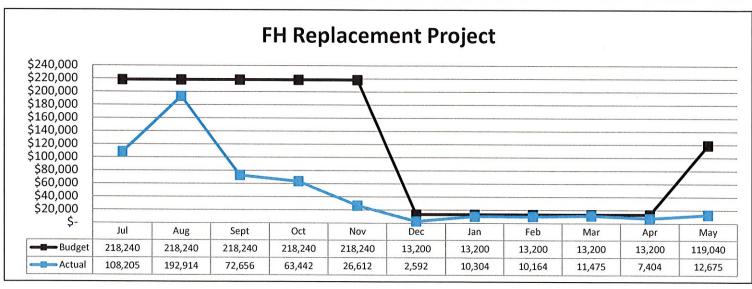
Eucalyptus Program Expenditures



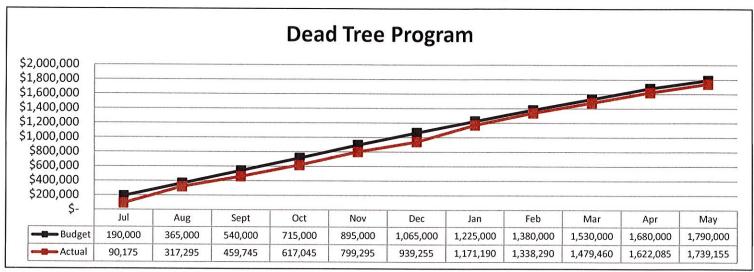
Financial Amendment to Consultant Report Projects and Programs - Budget vs. Actual Line Charts Monthly Actual Billed vs. Budgeted

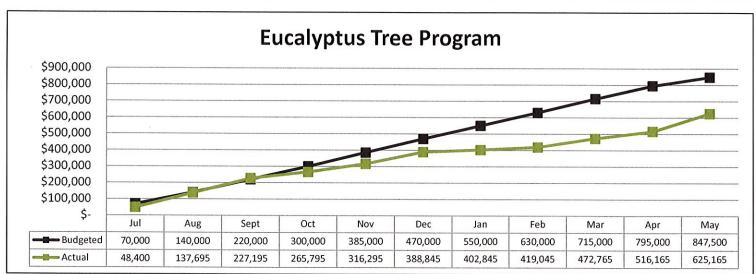


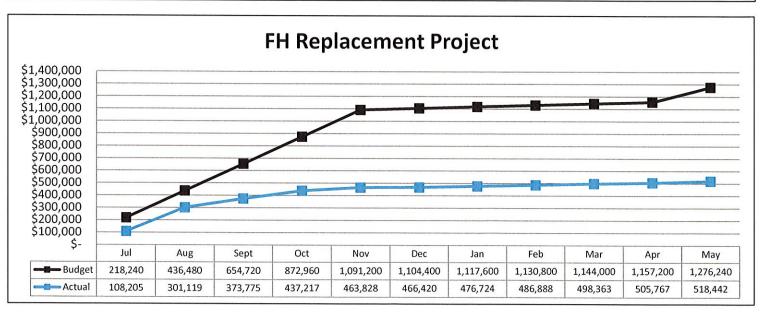




Financial Amendment to Consultant Report Projects and Programs - Budget vs. Actual Line Charts Cumulative Actual Billed vs. Budgeted

The schedule assumes the fire hdrants to be replaced or serviced along Page Mill Road are within the Town of Los Altos Hills right-of-way and an encroachment permit from the City of Palo Alto will not be required.

The following is a status update summary for the planning phase of the Phase VIII project since the last May 17th BOC meeting:

The total number of existing hydrants to replaced/ serviced as part of the Phase VIII project has been reduced from 146 to 122 hydrants, which has been coordinated/ reconciled with both LAHCFD and PHWD staff.

PCG coordinated a field visit w/ LAHCFD on May 26th to review public/ private FHs. Coordinated with PHWD staff to provide field markings of existing water main and hydrant laterals to include in to the scope of work for about six hydrants. Confirmed with the Town the preliminary list of streets to be paved as part of the Town's 2016 Pavement Rehabilitation Project. The Town is proposing to repave six streets. All existing hydrants along the six streets have been previously replaced with the current standard (Clow Model No. 960). No Phase VIII work is anticipated along these streets.

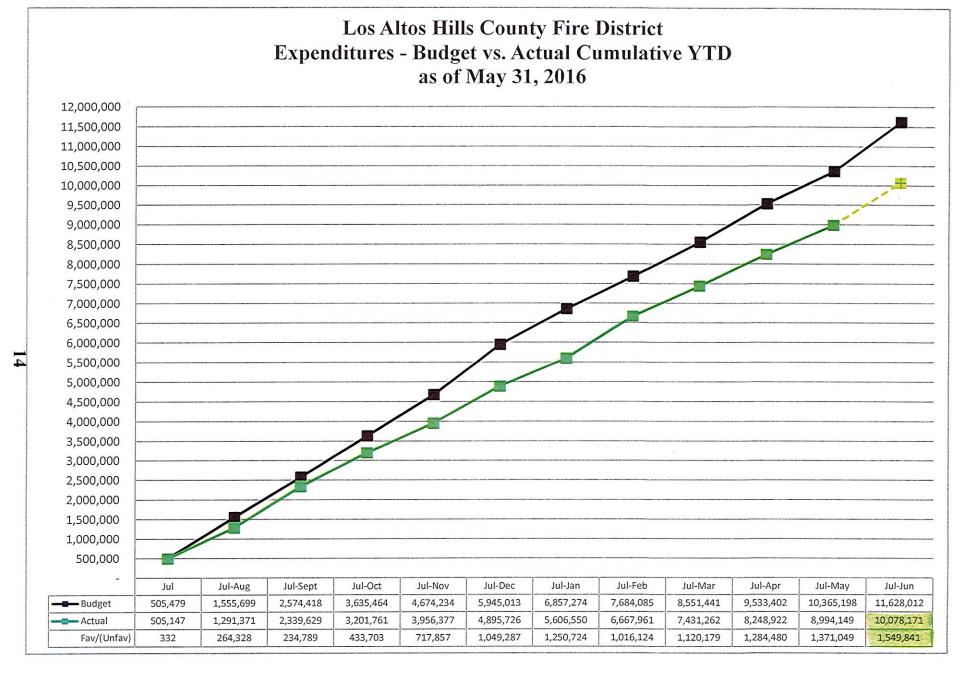
