

BEFORE A DISASTER

1. Keep this OK CARD in a place where you can easily find it.
2. Go to www.losaltoshills.ca.gov or ready.gov to study and prepare.
3. Visit www.lahcfd.org to attend a Personal Emergency Preparedness class or to become a CERT member.



AFTER A DISASTER

Place this card where visible from the street (front door, mailbox, gate, etc.) to communicate to your neighbors and first responders that you are OK.

USING A FIRE EXTINGUISHER

Remember P.A.S.S.

1. Pull the pin.
2. Aim at the base of the fire.
3. Squeeze the handle.
4. Sweep from side to side.



TURNING OFF ELECTRICITY

You may want to turn the electricity to your house off in the event you are evacuating your house for a period of time or you smell electrical burning in your house following a disaster.

1. Locate your electrical panel, usually in the vicinity of the electrical meter.
2. Flip all individual room switches to "OFF" position, then flip the master switch to "OFF" to cut power to your whole house.
3. To turn power back on, flip master switch to "ON," then flip individual switches to "ON."

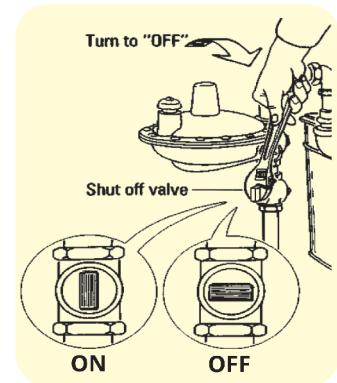


TURNING OFF GAS

Only turn your gas off if you smell or hear gas escaping, see a broken gas line, or otherwise suspect a gas leak; there may be a considerable delay before PG&E can turn your gas back on. **Note: Once your gas is turned off, leave it off until service can be restored safely by PG&E or another qualified professional.**

Never turn the gas back on yourself!

1. Locate your main gas service shutoff valve, usually located on the side or in front of the home, or in a cabinet enclosure (locations may vary). If you are unable to locate the gas service shutoff valve, contact PG&E for assistance.
2. Use a 12- to 15-inch adjustable pipe or crescent-type wrench, or other suitable tool to give the valve a quarter turn; the valve is closed when the tang (the part you put the wrench on) is crosswise to the pipe.
