Dear Los Altos Hills County Fire District Resident,

The Los Altos Hills County Fire District (LAHCFD) is here to support your preparedness efforts for emergencies and disasters. We encourage you to prepare yourself, your family, and your home before an emergency or disaster because no one knows when another disaster may strike.

After a natural disaster, such as an earthquake, Police, Fire, and Paramedic services will be in high demand and may not be available for immediate assistance. Residents are encouraged to be prepared and to have food, water, and supplies for at least 72 hours, as resources may not be available.



To assist you with your preparedness efforts, enclosed is an **OK Card**, which can be used after an earthquake, for example, to show first responders who are surveying neighborhoods that you are OK and do not need assistance.



After a disaster, if you are OK, secure to mailbox, entry gate, or another location easily visible from the street, with the OK side facing the street. If you need immediate assistance, dial 9-1-1.

Tune into 89.7 FM and check social media, etc. (see back of letter for resources.)



LAHCFD also encourages you to make 2021 **A Year of Resiliency**. The enclosed calendar offers steps you can take to prepare yourself, your family, and your home for an emergency, as well as class offerings to enhance your readiness. IF YOU NEED IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE: Dial 9-1-1



IF YOU ARE OK: Post the **OK Card** in a location that is visible from the street to communicate that you are OK to first responders and community emergency volunteers.
